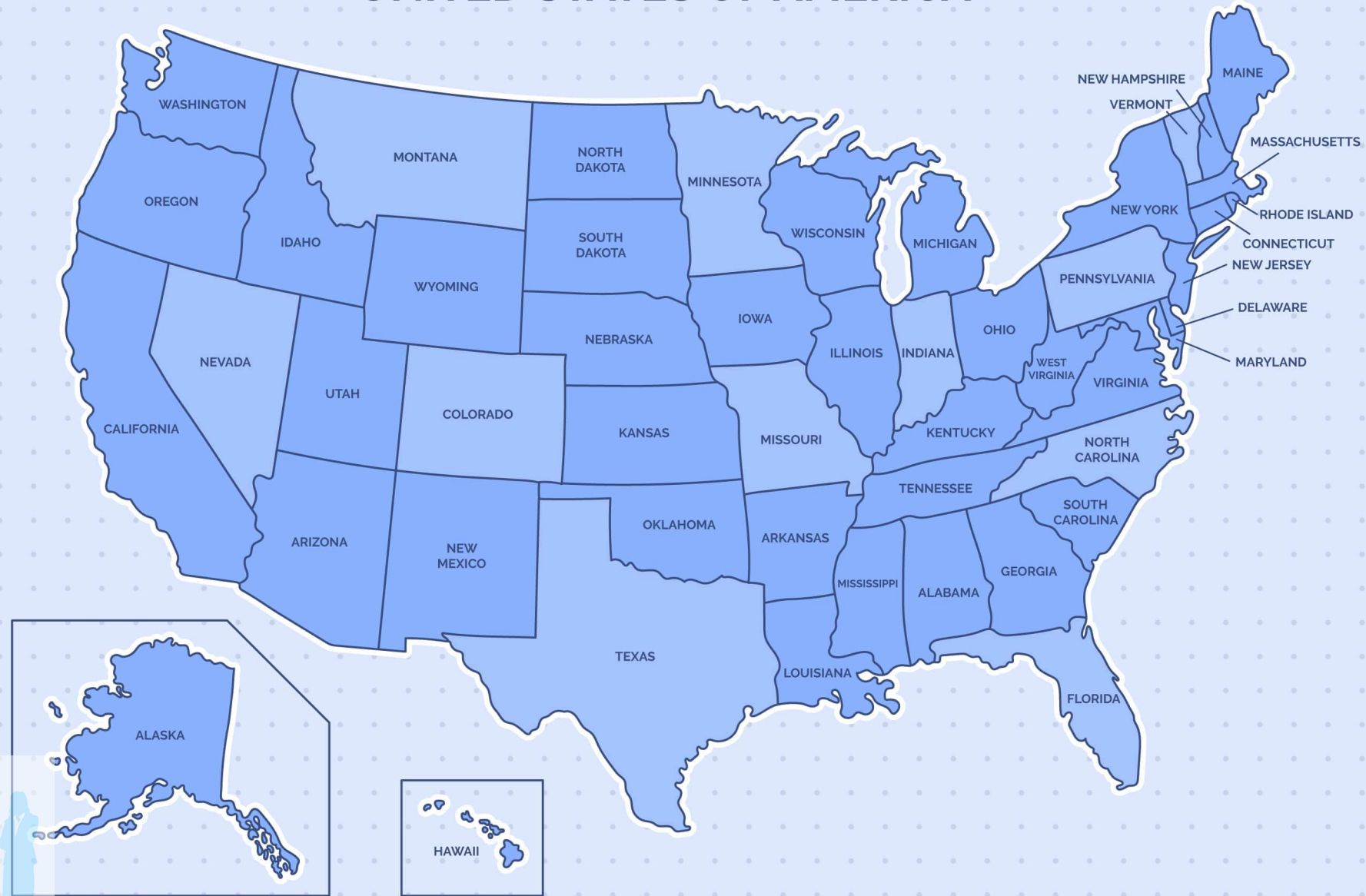

- Examples – Drexel University, Hofstra University and Suffolk University.

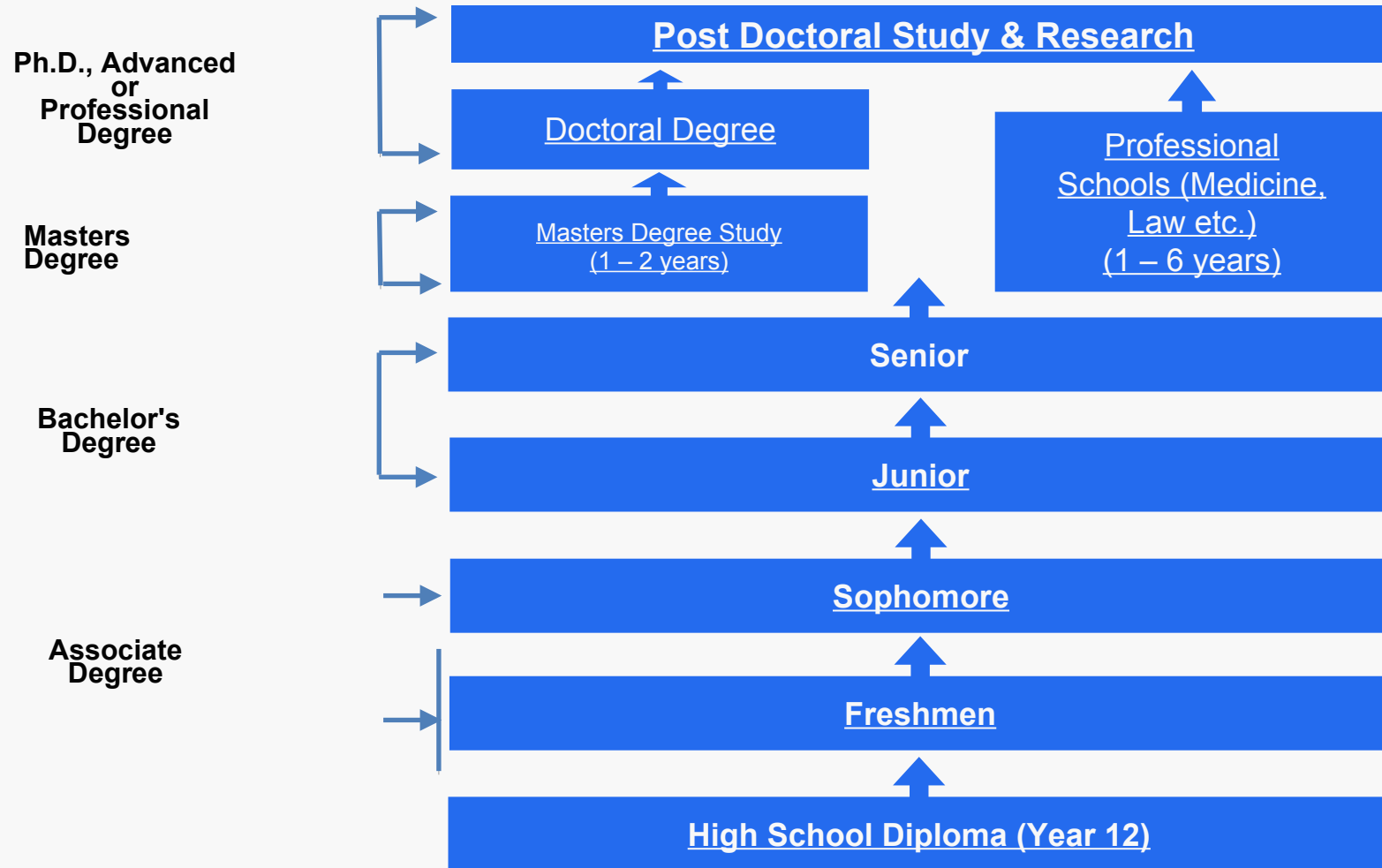
Community Colleges

Types of Degrees offered in USA Education System



Degrees Offered in USA

High School Diploma

Options available to pursue high school from 9th grade to 12th grade.

Associate Degrees:

- Two-year undergraduate academic degree
- Awarded by community colleges
- Requires completion of 60 to 65 credit hours

Benefits of an Associate Degree:

Transfer to a 4-Year University
Lower cost than a 4-year college.
Shorter time to completion.

Bachelor's Degrees:

- Four-year undergraduate academic degree
- Awarded by universities or **colleges**
- Requires **120 credit hours**

Master's Degrees:

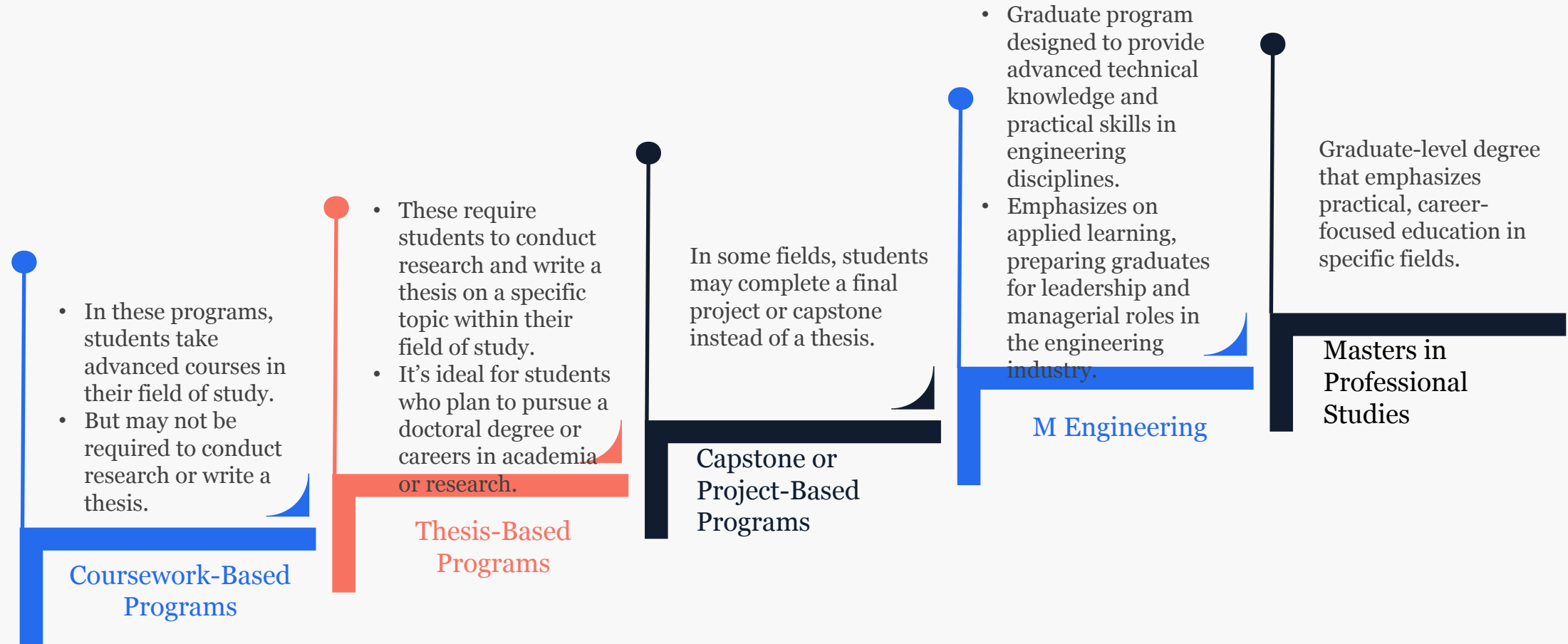
- **Majorly 2** years of full-time study (Some degree can 1 year or 3 years for completion).
- Awarded by universities or colleges
- Requires **30-60 credit hours**
- Types of Master's Degree Programs

Doctoral Degrees:

- Usually takes **3 years and above**
- Typically requires completion of **60 to 90 credit hours**.
- Involves **research** and the completion of a **dissertation or thesis**.



Types of Master's Degree Programs



Professional Programs

♦ 1. Medicine (MD)

- **Cannot be pursued directly after high school.**
- Students must first complete a **4-year bachelor's degree**, usually with pre-med coursework (biology, chemistry, physics, etc.).
- Then they take the **MCAT** (Medical College Admission Test).
- After that, they apply to medical school (MD).

♦ 2. Law (JD)

- Also a **postgraduate degree**.
- Requires a **bachelor's degree first**, in any major (though many choose political science, philosophy, etc.).
- Students take the **LSAT** (Law School Admission Test) or **GRE** (some schools accept it).
- Then they apply for a **Juris Doctor (JD)** program.

♦ 3. Nursing

To apply for Nursing, Student has to complete bachelors in any related degree in USA like BS Biology, BS Biomedical Science, BS Pre Nursing or BS Nursing (Traditional) then has to give NCLAT Exam, after that they can apply for Nursing Schools.

♦ Why This System?

The U.S. favors a **broad undergraduate education**. The idea is to:

- Give students time to explore interests.
- Build critical thinking and writing skills.

Entry Requirements

Undergraduate:

- Mandatory Requirements:
 - Academic: 55%+ in 10th & 12th
 - IELTS: 6.0+, TOEFL: 70+, PTE: 53+, DET: 100+
- Optional Requirements:
 - Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT), Minimum score of 1150+
 - American College Testing (ACT), Minimum score of 25+

Graduate:

- Mandatory Requirements:
 - Academic: 56%+ in Bachelor's (Check if student has completed 3years bachelor's degree or 4 years bachelors degree)
 - Check for the backlogs (Varying as per university)
 - IELTS: 6.5+, TOEFL: 8+, PTE: 56+, DET: 110+
- Optional Requirements:
 - Graduate Record Examination (GRE), Minimum score of 290 to 300+
 - Graduate Management Admission Test(GMAT), Minimum score of 550+

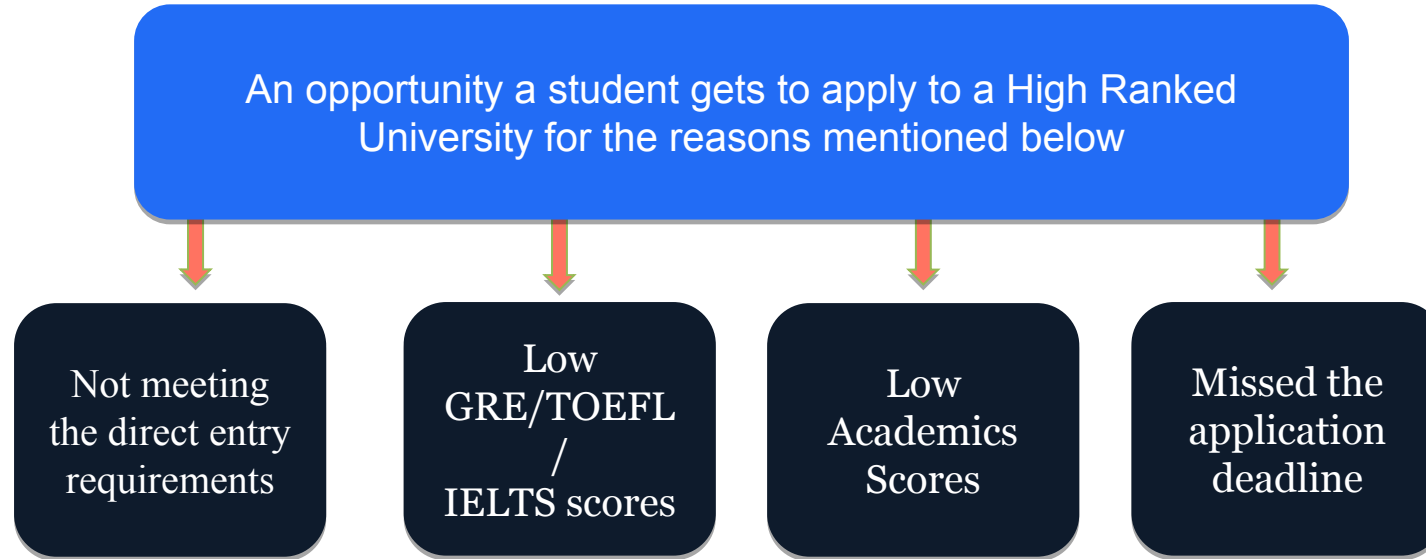
Exceptions for Graduate Entry Requirements

Not all the universities in USA accept 3 years bachelors degree. To accept the 3 years bachelors degree, they look for either of the below conditions:

- 1) Student's previous college or university should be 'NAAC A' accredited and student must have scored grades in Division I.
- 2) Student must have done the NACES approved External Credential Evaluation to convert the score reports to USA Equivalent grades to determine USA Equivalency



Pathways and their Unique selling points



USP's of Pathways :

- Student gets a chance to apply to a high ranked university.
- Additional support to the International students.
- GRE and SAT waivers for PG and UG students, respectively.
- As most of the universities direct admission deadline is passed, they can apply through pathway.
- Groups/Universities offering Pathways: INTO, Kaplan, Shorelight, Drexel University, Virginia Tech Language and Culture Institute, Washington State University

Introduction to Groups

Some universities, pathway colleges, satellite campuses, or private colleges outsource their recruitment processes to private entities.

These private entities carry out the entire admission process, from marketing and applications to commissions.

Academic Documents

- **Academic Marksheets:**
 - Submit **10th, 11th, and 12th-grade marksheets**
 - If currently pursuing 12th grade: submit **9th, 10th, and 11th marksheets**
 - Some universities may also request **predicted 12th-grade scores**
- **For IB Board:**
 - Schools can send **official transcripts via email** directly to the university

English Proficiency

- **English Proficiency Scorecard** (IELTS/TOEFL/PTE/DET)
- **IB Board Students:**
 - Some universities may waive English proficiency for admission
 - However, scores are **recommended for scholarship eligibility**

Passport – First and last page

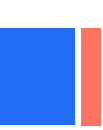
- **Additional Documents**

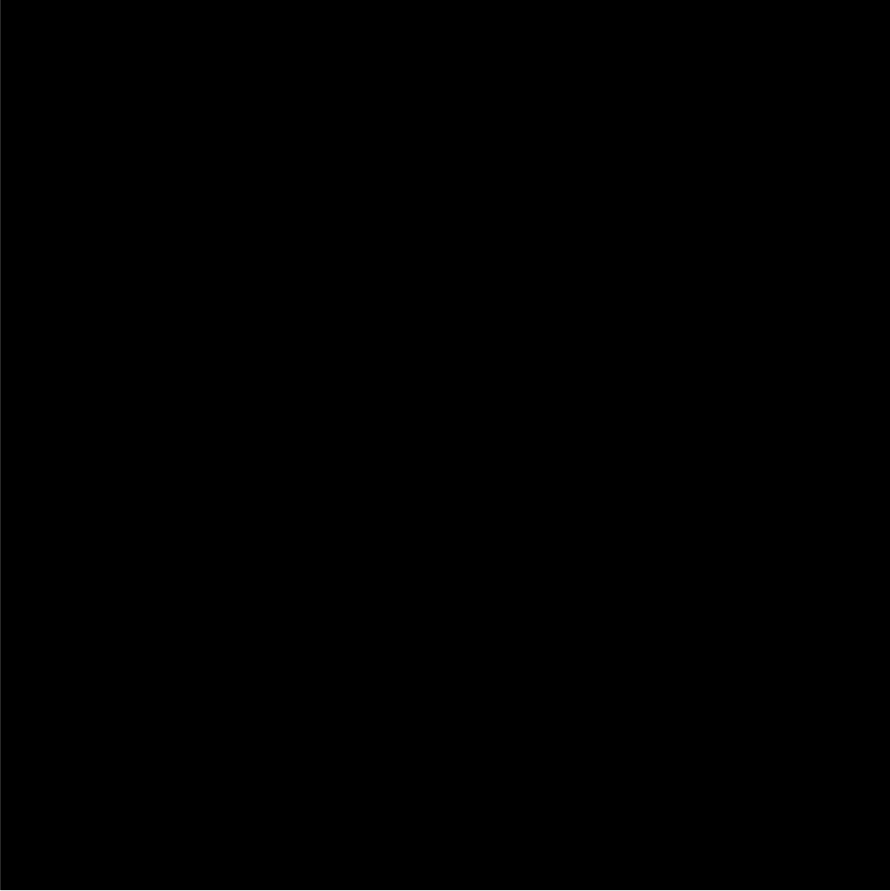
Graduate Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's marksheets (individual & consolidated), degree/provisional certificate
 - *If pursuing final year:* Submit 7th sem marksheet & bonafide certificate
 - Some universities accept up to 6th Sem + Bonafide for early decision
- English proficiency score (IELTS/TOEFL/Duolingo)
- Passport (First & Last page)
- 2–3 Letters of Recommendation
- Statement of Purpose / Essay
- GRE/GMAT scores (if required)
- Financial documents (may be required at application stage)
- Portfolio (for Design, Architecture, MFA programs)

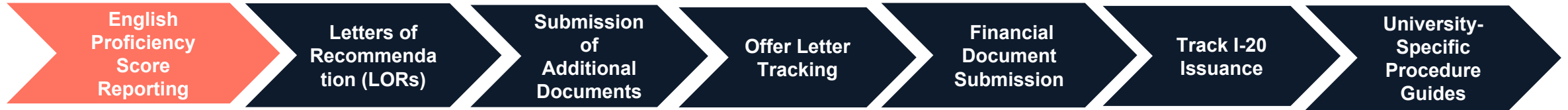




Post-Application Submission Process

- 
- Get English proficiency Score reporting done by student if required by university.
 - Get the online letters of recommendation completed by the professors of the student.
 - Get any additional documentation like portfolio(Slide room), Supplemental Application, DEW Form, Agent Authorization letter completed.
 - Get the Offer Letters
 - Submit financial documents for I-20
 - Track I-20 issuance
 - Refer Procedure Guides of respective universities for specific process.

TRANSITION PLAN



Action: Ensure the student reports their English proficiency test scores (TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, Duolingo, etc.) **directly to the university**, if not already done during application.

When Required: Only if the university mandates it as part of their admissions requirement.

How to Check: Verify via Procedure Guide or the university's official website.



TRANSITION PLAN



Action: Follow up with the student to complete and submit online LORs by student's professors.

Tips: Make sure professors receive the system-generated email and links.
Remind them of deadlines to avoid processing delays.



TRANSITION PLAN



Includes, but not limited to:

Portfolio: Via SlideRoom or equivalent platform.

Supplemental Application Forms

Agent Authorization Letter/ (DEW) Form/Consent Form

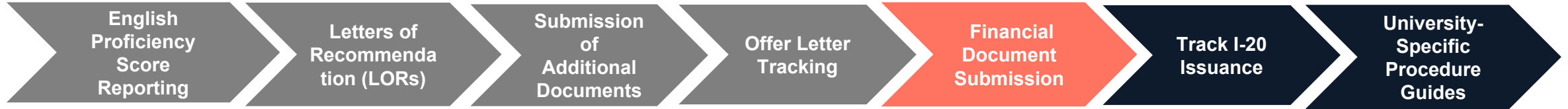
Action: Monitor and follow up on issuance of Offer Letters.

Tool: Use your internal CRM system or the flow chart process created by the institution.

Next Steps: Move to financial documentation stage once offer is received.

Action:

Collect and submit:
Student's/Parent's bank statements
Affidavit of Support (if applicable)
Sponsor letters (if needed)

Note: Must meet the minimum financial threshold stated by the university for I-20 issuance.



TRANSITION PLAN



Action:

Monitor the university portal or coordinate with admissions teams to track when the I-20 is issued.

Next Steps:

Coordinate with the student for visa appointment booking once I-20 is received.

Action:

Always refer to the official Procedure Guide of the respective university.

Each university has unique processes and documentation requirements which must be followed precisely.

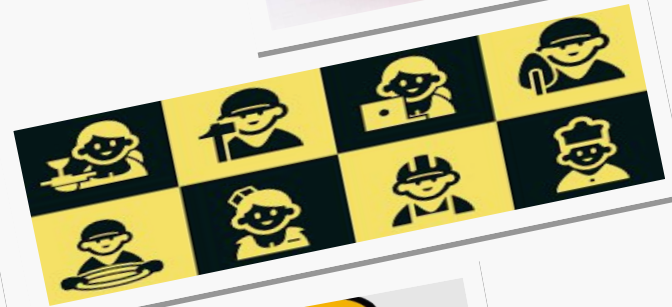
On – Campus Employment:

- Can work on campus 20 hrs./week during study time
- Can work full time (i.e., 40 hrs./week) during holidays

Positions include:

- Teaching Assistantship
- Research Assistantship
- Fellowship
- Hourly Employment- Food Services, Library,
- Event Coordinator, Laboratory Assistant, etc.

Work Rights

Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

- Provides opportunity **to gain actual employment experience.**
- “An integral part of an established curriculum”.
- Defined as “alternate work/study, internship, cooperative education,
 - or any other type of required internship or practicum which is offered by sponsoring employers through cooperative agreements with the school.”
- To be eligible for CPT, student **must have completed 9 months in lawful status and currently be on F-1 status.**
- CPT can be full time (>20 hours week) or part time (20 hours or less per week).



Work Rights

Optional Practical Training (OPT):

- Available to students who are lawfully enrolled on a full – time basis & have completed at least 1 full academic year.
- Eligible student may request OPT in order to be employed in a position related to the major area of study.
- 12 (Non STEM)/36 (STEM) months of OPT available after each degree level completion.



01

OPT must be **directly related** to your field of study

02

You can apply for OPT up to **90 days before** your program end date and no later than **60 days after** it ends

03

You **must not** have used **more than 12 months of full-time CPT** (Curricular Practical Training), or you might lose OPT eligibility

Steps for VISA

What is the U.S. Student (F-1) Visa?

- The **F-1 Visa** is a non-immigrant visa that allows international students to study full-time at an accredited U.S. college or university.
- It is issued to students who have received an admission offer and an official **Form I-20** from a U.S. institution.
- The visa is typically valid for the **duration of the academic program** and allows entry into the U.S. within a month before the course start date.
- Students on an F-1 visa are eligible for:
 - **On-campus employment**
 - **Optional Practical Training (OPT)** after graduation
 - **Curricular Practical Training (CPT)** during studies (if applicable)

Why the SEVIS fee payment is necessary:

- **Tracking and Monitoring:** The SEVIS fee helps fund the system used by U.S. immigration authorities to monitor international students, exchange visitors, and their dependents while they are in the U.S. The system keeps track of their enrollment status, academic progress, and ensures they comply with U.S. visa rules.
- **Visa Processing and Administrative Costs:** The SEVIS fee helps cover the costs of maintaining and updating the SEVIS database, processing visa applications, and administering the system that supports the overall visa process for students and exchange visitors.
- **Security and Compliance:** By collecting the SEVIS fee, the U.S. government ensures that schools and institutions comply with federal regulations regarding international students. It also enables authorities to easily verify that students are enrolled in a legitimate academic program and are attending classes as required by their visa.
- **Prevention of Immigration Violations:** The SEVIS fee helps to reduce the risk of students overstaying their visas or engaging in activities outside the scope of their visa category. By monitoring students throughout their stay, the U.S. can identify and address any violations of immigration law.
- **Student and Exchange Visitor Support:** The SEVIS system provides support to students and exchange visitors, helping them navigate their visa status, maintain legal status, and communicate with U.S. authorities if needed.
- Overall, the SEVIS fee is part of the U.S. government's system to ensure that international students comply with the terms of their visas and to maintain the integrity of the U.S. immigration system.

Funds to be shown for I-20 Issuance

- The I-20 form will provide an estimate of the cost of attendance, which you should use as a guide (This amount is for 9 months (1 academic year) which includes tuition + living + other expenses)
- For I-20 we need a bank balance certificate which shows the required amount for 1 year study cost. Always keep 500-1000 USD more than the I-20 required amount.
- Annual scholarships can be deducted from the total amount.
- When filling out sponsor details, use parent or family funds instead of listing yourself as the sponsor.
- You can combine different funding sources, such as bank statements, scholarship letters, and loan approval documents.
- Bank balance certificates of multiple banks can be combined to arrive at the required amount.
- One day old funds are accepted by most US universities.



What is I20

In the United States, the **Form I-20** is a critical immigration document issued by a **SEVP-certified** (Student and Exchange Visitor Program) school to international students who have been accepted to study there. It is officially called the "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status."

Key points about the I-20

- **Purpose:** It allows a student to apply for an **F-1** (academic student) or **M-1** (vocational student) visa.
- **Issued by:** The Designated School Official (DSO) at the U.S. school.
- **Contents:** Includes details like the student's SEVIS ID number, program of study, duration of the program, and financial resources.

Use

- Apply for an F-1 visa at a U.S. embassy or consulate.
- Enter the U.S. in student status.
- Maintain legal status while studying in the U.S.
- Travel internationally and return to the U.S.
- Apply for benefits like a driver's license or work authorization (e.g., CPT or OPT).
